General Purpose of Job:

Research Representative's duties include reviewing accounts and determining the proper status based on information gathered. Representatives analyze previous healthcare insurance activity on hospital accounts, and determine the best course of action to be taken. The ability to quickly learn and use various hospital-based computer systems is required. Familiarity with third party insurance in a healthcare setting is desired. Strong attention to detail & accuracy in processing data skills are essential. Proficiency in PC usage and excellent typing ability is needed. Researchers play a key role in directing accounts to the appropriate departments in order to generate timely payment. Researchers identify and forward potential insurance leads to insurance collectors while ensuring all accounts are sent to proper departments for processing.

Essential Duties and Responsibilities:

- **Familiarity with third party insurance in a healthcare setting is preferred. Must type 55 WPM**
- Access client host networks to cross reference reasons that insurance did not pay to determine if an appeal may be necessary
- If insurance lead is not identified, account is forwarded to private pay
- Identification of bankruptcy, legal and deceased with and without estate to forward to proper department
- Skip tracing accounts to identify new location information to provide to collectors
- Follow all office procedures to maintain integrity of company
- Ensure all applicable federal and state laws are followed at all times
- Other duties as assigned
